PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Our **Level 3 Early Years Educator Apprenticeship** prepares highly trained professionals to support the learning, development, and care of children from birth to 5 years old. Early Years Educators ensure children are safe, healthy, and able to thrive in nurturing environments, while meeting the requirements of the **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)**.

Learners will gain the skills to:

- Deliver high-quality early education and care
 Support children's physical, cognitive, and emotional development
- Promote equality, diversity and inclusion in childcare settings
- Work with families, carers and professionals to improve outcomes
- Apply the observation, assessment and planning cycle to track progress and support development

Early Years Educators play a vital role in helping children build strong foundations for lifelong learning.

Who is this Programme for?

This programme is designed for individuals working or aspiring to work in:

- >>> Nurseries and pre-schools
- >>> Children's centres and nursery schools
- >>> Reception classes in primary schools
- >>> Home-based childcare (childminders, assistants)
- >>> Out-of-school or playgroup settings

It is ideal for:

- Early years assistants ready to progress to a qualified practitioner role
- Those wanting to meet DfE "full and relevant" criteria for working at Level 3 in childcare settings
- Practitioners supporting children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Learners will build knowledge, skills and behaviours across:

- Child Development understanding milestones, learning through play, and holistic development
- >>> Safeguarding & Welfare keeping children safe, recognising signs of harm, and following policies
- Inclusive Practice supporting children with SEND, promoting diversity, equality and inclusion
- Health & Safety ensuring safe environments indoors and outdoors
 Observation & Assessment monitoring progress and planning
 learning experiences
- >>> Partnership with Families working effectively with parents, carers and multi-agency professionals
- >>> Teaching & Learning supporting language, communication, early literacy, numeracy, and school readiness

Typical job roles include:

- Nursery Educator / Nursery Nurse / Nursery Worker
- Early Years Educator / Early Years Worker
- Childminder Assistant

What to Expect

The apprenticeship is delivered through a **blend of theory, workplace learning and reflective practice.**

You can expect:

Practical Application – opportunities to apply learning directly in the workplace

Reflective Supervision – building self-awareness and professional judgement

Portfolio building - case studies, reflective journals and observations

ASSESSMENT

Assessment is through an **End-Point Assessment (EPA)** which includes:

- 1: Observation with Questions
 - Assessed in the workplace (minimum 1 hr 20 mins)
 - Assessor asks follow-up questions
- 2: Professional Discussion (with Portfolio Evidence)
 - 90-minute discussion with assessor
 - Questions cover knowledge, skills and behaviours
 - Portfolio is used to support evidence

Grades available: Pass, Merit, Distinction

Learners must hold:

• Paediatric First Aid or Emergency Paediatric First Aid certificate

Qualification Achieved

On successful completion, apprentices will achieve:

- Level 3 Early Years Educator Apprenticeship Standard
- Professional recognition as "Full and Relevant at Level 3" under Department for Education guidelines

This allows learners to:

- Count towards statutory staff/child ratios at Level 3 in early years settings
- Progress into higher-level roles such as Room Leader, Deputy Manager or Early Years Teacher (via further study)
